- Troop successfully competed at Klondike 3<sup>rd</sup> place
- Moving March campout to Wright Patterson Airforce Base not camping on base –
  Camp Birch hopefully and visit museum
- Justin G. COH Saturday schedule a regular COH for end of March
- Training- adults looking at climbing training dependent on what is provided
- Consider other option for June climbing campout
- Need to reserve campouts early Hocking Hills for Oct if we don't do June no penalty cancelation
- Need to think about planning the first half of next year so we can get reservations to some of the places that need early reservations. Outdoor Y and Hocking Hills especially.
- Usage of phones at campouts, as well as, coming and going mainly without notice. Scott will allow scouts to be responsible, but if it doesn't work then he will take control. Some scouts leaving campouts early for sports, but asking that they try to come back. Don't want to make them choose. Coming and going is a safety issue. Can we have a designated person that they go to for notice....and let the boys know who that is.

## **SPL Update - Scott**

- Phones talked at PLC and talked to patrol leaders Scott will be monitoring. Same rule goes for leaders to set an example and not also be on phones.
- Klondike council merging and there are more Klondike's thinking that was a factor in how small it was and they didn't push for Webelos. Air rifle didn't have anyone at it, so we should plan for not running air rifle or smaller hot chocolate station because there weren't Webelos there. Scouts could have been doing other things.

  - Council has not set a date for level 2 training.
  - # of our adults are getting level 1. It's in April, during Camporee weekend. 4/24-4/26.
  - Level 2 will not happen in May. They gave Bill a list of schedules for National Camp School. You could get certified as a director for the council. Dave M. did it, Bill did it. 5 years before it expires. We had ~15 years of instructors. They're suggesting we could do our own troop program outside of council training. It's a week long. If anyone wants to be certified, let Bill and John U know. Closest one at Bechtel, WV. 2 sessions. 1 in NY. Others scattered around the country. Cost \$475. Could be possible the council would pay all or some...or the troop could. For the council training, the person who approves our syllabus hasn't done so yet. Our council can't get the paperwork through the regional office. [Since this meeting we found another available Level 2 training at Manatoc May 8-10.
