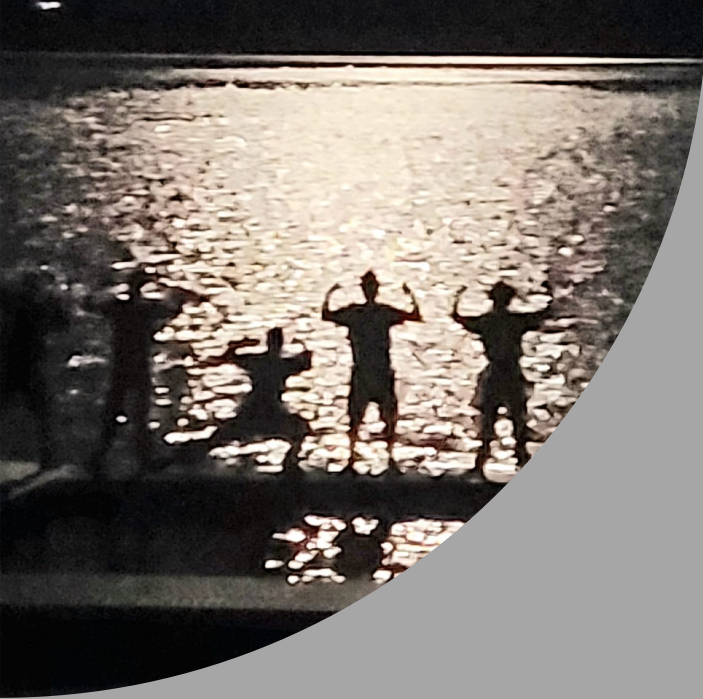

## OBJECTIVE OF THE INVITATIONAL:

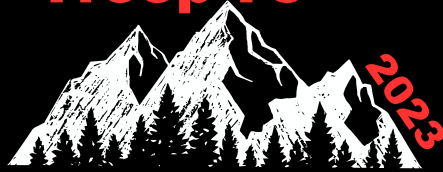
